

# We Thought You'd Like to Know...

- The Museum's collections include items collected since the late 19th century, such as the Father Schmitz Collection, displayed in the exhibition "Treasures of Biodiversity".
- In the early 20th century nature-lovers and collectors hunted animals in order to study the species and enrich their collections.
- Nowadays there is no active hunting of birds or mammals. Items that reach the collection are mainly animals that died in nature and were collected by the Israel Nature and Parks Authority.
- Most of the display items in the Museum's exhibitions are prepared by taxidermy – the reconstruction or preservation of animals for the purposes of display and research.
- Each year, tens of thousands of new items are added to the collections through active collection, monitoring, teaching and research by the Museum staff.

- Most of the items in the Museum's natural history collections are insects. The exhibition "Bugs and Beyond" includes 17 terrariums housing live insects.
- The Museum includes more than 3,000 display items. In general, it is difficult to visit the entire Museum during one visit. We recommend you consult with the Museum staff to plan a route that suits your current visit, and the rest – during your next visit.
- To intensify your experience, many items are displayed without being protected by glass (display cabinet).
- We ask you to look after the items and avoid touching them, except for those that may be touched, which are labeled accordingly.
